Collier Mosquito Control District Controls Fixed Assets With Sage FAS Gov Fixed Assets

The mission of Florida’s Collier Mosquito Control District (CMCD) is to serve the community by suppressing pestiferous and disease-carrying mosquito populations to a tolerable level in the safest, most economical manner. The District carries out its mission while utilizing a variety of methods in a way that minimizes potential effects on people, wildlife, and the environment.



Controlling the mosquito population for 98 percent of Collier County, and covering 401 square miles, CMCD is the role model for other mosquito control districts. With a dedicated, motivated workforce of nearly 30 employees who support the District’s mission, CMCD does a lot with its \$8 million annual operating budget.

The District was required to comply with the third level of GASB 34. CMCD’s fixed assets include several buildings, eight aircraft, computer equipment, and various automobiles.

The District’s finance department sought a fixed asset management system to help it comply with Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement 34, which requires all state and local entities to track and depreciate fixed assets on an annual basis.

More Control Over Data

Welch also enjoys the reports she can easily create using the automated fixed asset management software. Her auditors like them too.
